Cost estimates for the phases have changed since this presentation.






3. The latest estimates for burying the power lines at the entrance of the neighborhood are between \$96K - \$120K depending on the difficulty of digging. This amount is approximately 37% to 57% of the PPMD's annual revenue. Reserve accounts have been built up over time to support extra projects and maintenance as required, and there are sufficient reserves for this project. This would reflect approximately 12% to 16% of our unallocated reserve funds.



5. In response to a previous survey the Perry Park Metropolitan District is expanding recreational opportunities in Perry Park. There are 2 properties owned by the district which have been identified as appropriate sites for recreational development: Wauconda Park and Gilloon Park. Gilloon Park is an approximately 10-acre parcel in the back of the park with a pond.


The district has recently mowed a trail through the park and would like to make it permanent with grading and a gravel surface. The cost will be approximately \$20,000. The monies used for this project will not come from taxpayer dollars but instead from the Conservation Trust Fund (CTF) which is funded by the State of Colorado lottery proceeds and can only be used for recreation development.


Do you support using the \$20,000 CTF money for creating a gravel pathway to make a more permanent walking trail around Gilloon pond park area?
